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1. INTRODUCTION

The successful bidder will be appointed for a period of Five (05) years.

8.1.1. SECTION 1: STANDARD BIDDING DOCUMENTS

8.1.2. SECTION 2: SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT

- Successful bidders will be required to submit proof of passenger liability insurance cover for not less than R5 million per incident.
- Successful bidders will be required to obtain an operating license before operations resumes. This means that the bidder must be the owner of the buses and or has a formalised agreement (Lease Agreement) to use the buses for the applicable service contract.
- Bidders must verify information provided regarding route descriptions and distances as the department will not be held responsible for any discrepancies.

- Bidders must provide driver names, ID numbers, certified copies of their driver's licenses and Professional Drivers Permit, (PrDP) after the award.
- Successful bidder must submit list of vehicles and certified copies of the registration certificates and licenses of all the vehicles to be used in the awarded contract/s.
- Successful bidders must submit vehicle roadworthy certificates of each vehicle in use every six months.
- Contracted vehicles will be subjected to six monthly inspections by Law Enforcement Officers(s) from the Department of Community Safety and Transport Management or appointed representatives.
- Bidders must ensure that the following persons are accommodated in their company and provide proof thereof: Women, Youth & People with disabilities and military Veterans attach (ID of Director / Owner CK / Company Registration Documents).
- Bidders who bid with the same vehicle for more than 5 routes will only be evaluated on the first 5 routes.

8.1.3. SECTION 3: GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

- The latest General Conditions of Contract (GCC) and Contract Law shall be applicable to this Bid and is obtainable by visiting the National Treasury website at www.treasury.gov.za.
- Bidders must familiarise themselves with these GCC.

8.1.4. LEGAL, ADMINISTRATIVE AND TECHNICAL MATTERS

8.1.4.1. SERVICES OUTSIDE THE CONTRACT

- No dual operation is allowed. Vehicles must be parked at schools and may not leave the premises whilst the learners are at school.

8.1.4.2. ACCESS AND DISCLOSURE

- The Department and any authorised person shall at all reasonable time have access to all vehicles and relevant documentation of the Operators for purposes of monitoring service quality.
- The Operator must, at the request of the Department, produce proof of validity of all licences, permits and other requirements arising from the contract, or where applicable, proof of application that has been made for such licences or permits. That must be provided or be furnished not later than 2 (two) working days from date of receipt of such written request.
- The Operator is obligated to notify the Department with written notice with Seven (7) days of any change regarding ownership control as contemplated in Section 44 of the Act and complete a declaration in respect of any new person or entity exercising such ownership control.

8.1.4.3. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

- All accounting records and proof of service provision must be kept for a minimum period of three (3) years after the termination of the contract.
- Where in terms of this contract, any amount is owed to the Department by the Operator, a certificate at hand of the Department responsible for management of the contract shall be prima facie proof:
 - that such amount is owing
 - of the fact that such certificate is officially signed, and
 - that the relevant amount is due and payable

8.1.4.4. CONDITION OF ACCEPTANCE

8.1.4.4.1. Inspection of routes:

- Prospective bidder/transport operator is required to check the routes and distance kilometres prior to the completion of bid documents.
- Prospective bidder/transport operator should notify the Department in writing of any discrepancy in kilometres before the closing of the bid.

The Department may investigate and amend any disparities in kilometres before and after the bid has been awarded.

8.1.4.4.2. Vehicle inspection:

- Successful bidders/transport operators will be required to bring their vehicles for inspection within 30 days after signing of the contract with Department of Community Safety and Transport Management.
- All successful bidders/transport operators' vehicles contracted to transport learners will be subjected to inspection at a designated place in the District once per term/quarter, or when and as it is required.

Failure to comply with this condition will result in the contract being terminated.

8.1.4.4.3. Code of Conduct:

- All successful service providers must submit police clearance for their appointed drivers when signing the contract.
- Successful bidder will be provided with a code of conduct when they sign a contract with the Department.
- Successful bidders are required to sign a code of conduct between themselves and their drivers and submit it to the Department of Community Safety and Transport Management.
- In case where successful bidder is also driver, he/she will sign both as the successful bidder and/or the driver.
- A signed code of conduct between the successful bidder/operator and the driver(s) should be kept in the car at all times

8.1.4.4.4. Valid South African Public Drivers Permit (PrDP):

- A valid and certified copy of the South African Professional Drivers Permit (PrDP) for every driver per vehicle must be attached to the claims every month.

Failure to submit a certified SA PrDP every month for the driver will result in claims not being processed.



8.1.4.4.5. Fire extinguisher:

- Buses, midi buses mini buses and train buses must have a serviced fire extinguisher at all times.

Failure to comply with this condition will result in claims not being paid/penalties being issued.

8.1.4.4.6. Operating times:

- Successful bidders / operators should ensure that learners are at school not earlier than 45 minutes and not later than 15 minutes before starting time during school days.
- Successful bidders / operators should ensure that learners are collected not later than 30 minutes after school.

NB: Failure to comply with this requirement will result in the trip undertaken not being paid / penalties being imposed.

8.1.4.4.7. Frequency:

- Learner transport project is meant for transportation of learners during school days only and does not include weekends, school holidays, trips for extramural activities or any extra classes organised by schools.

8.1.4.4.8. Pick up and drop off points:

- Pick up and drop off points shall be determined by the Department through respective schools.

8.1.4.4.9. Use of routes and roads:

- Routes and Roads to be used for transporting learners will be determined by the Department of Education in conjunction with the Department of Community Safety and Transport Management and not by the transport operators.

8.1.4.4.10. Formula for Claims:

- Successful bidders / operators will be paid according to the distance (kilometres) as indicated in the appointment letter and the number of school days as indicated in the delivery note, supplied by the operator and signed by the Principal / Monitor. The remuneration model is as follows: **kilometres x days x rate.**

- **Successful bidders / operators will claim for return trips only.**
- Monthly claims for services delivered must be submitted not later than the 7th of the following month in order to comply with PFMA prescripts. All operators are expected to claim on monthly basis.

Failure to comply with this condition will result in claims being delayed.

8.1.4.4.11. Contract:

8.1.4.4.11.1. Termination

The Department may terminate the contract where it discovers that:

- Operator has committed an act of insolvency or is actually insolvent in that the operator liabilities exceed his/her assets
- Operator has published a notice to surrender his/her estate or has presented a petition for the acceptance of the surrender of his/her estate as insolvent
- The closing of schools, transfer of learners to hostels, reduction of the number of learners being transported, or reduction in the number of kilometres travelled, vehicles donated to the department or the department acquiring its own vehicles. In event that owner or sole proprietor passes away the contract will be terminated with immediate effect.
- Non-performance will lead to termination of the contract. This refers to :
 - ✓ Failure to collect learners continuously
 - ✓ Late for 3 consecutive months
 - ✓ Failure to submit invoices on time
- In case of any existence of the above mentioned factors, the Department reserves the right to terminate the contract and the Department will re-consider the future of the affected route and learners. It includes
 - ✓ Transport not compliant to regulation of license.
 - ✓ Failure to collect learners for 3 consecutive occasions.
- In case of any withdrawal, the Department reserves the right to temporarily appoint from a pool of existing operators to avoid disruption of service.

8.1.4.4.11.2. Amendment of the contract:

- Contracts will be amended to be in line with the actual distance travelled.
- If distance travelled increase or decrease, the contract will be amended to be in line with increased or decreased kilometres on condition that the route is viable.

- Each case will be treated on its merits and demerits.
- If number of learners increase or decrease, the contract will be amended to be in line with increased or decreased number of learners on condition that the route is viable.

8.1.4.4.11.3. Monitoring of routes will be conducted as follows:

- Departmental officials visiting the area of operation.
- Electronic monitoring
- Physical monitoring

8.2. OPERATION OF SERVICES

- Safety is of paramount importance in the transportation of learners to and from school each day. The Operator must ensure that safe and reliable services are provided. The Operator must deliver a reliable service with drivers and vehicles that comply with all licensing and regulatory requirements and are well maintained, to ensure learners arrive at school on time and ready to learn.
- The Operator must exercise the highest degree of skill, care and diligence in the provision of the services and operate the services strictly in accordance with Specifications of Contract as adjusted from time to time, as well as the other relevant provisions of the contract, to the satisfaction of the Department.
- No amendments to the Specifications are to be made without the prior written approval by the Department, which will not unreasonably be withheld.
- The Operator must comply with and strictly adhere to the Department's instructions and directions regarding the operation of the services.
- The Operator must take instructions and directions only from the Department.
- The Operator shall ensure that all staff (employed or contracted) treats learners with respect and courtesy at all times, and all reasonable assistance is offered to facilitate the safe travel of a learner.
- The Operator will ensure policies are in place advising staff (employed or contracted) and subcontractors of their obligation to act in a professional manner at all times when acting in relation to this contract and delivering any of the services provided under it, and will have systems to deal with breaches to these policies.

- The Operator will not, by its acts or omissions, do anything that would damage the reputation of the Department and the integrity of Government policies at all times whilst carrying out the services.
- The Operator shall ensure that all written and oral communication it has with schools and members of the public regarding the delivery of the services is helpful, timely and professional. The Operator shall acknowledge and record all written or emailed complaints or correspondence it receives regarding the delivery of the services and provides the Department with copies of such correspondence.
- Depending on the requirements of the contract as to which type or combination of types of vehicles are to be provided by the Operator, the latter must provide for each trip a vehicle having the passenger capacity as specified in the tender forms that conforms fully with the requirements and attributes specified in the contract.
- The Operator shall have no cause to refuse to convey a learner on a trip or part thereof unless the learner makes him / herself guilty of violent, abusive or otherwise offensive conduct. Such cases must be reported to the School and Department.
- Should the Operator become aware of circumstances or problems which have prevented it, are preventing it or will prevent it from providing the services as specified, the Operator must, as soon as is reasonably possible after becoming so aware, advise the Department of such circumstances or problems and also indicate the manner in which the provision of the services were, are or are going to be influenced thereby, if applicable. Such advice must be confirmed in writing as soon as reasonably possible.
- Only stops/pick up points authorised by the Department are to be used by the Operator.
- The performance of the service by the Operator shall be observed, monitored and inspected by the Department at its own discretion for compliance with this Contract.
- In addition to any statutory obligations, the Operator must, within twenty-four (24) hours of its occurrence, report to the Department any accident in which persons have been injured or killed. This must be followed by a written report containing full details of the occurrence within four (4) weekdays of the occurrence.
- The Operator must forthwith upon the occurrence of any of the following events notify the Department in writing of the details thereof:

- Any revocation, suspension or refusal to renew any licence or permit necessary for the provision of the services, and
- The imposition of any condition upon such licence or permit or any other circumstance which would prevent the Operator from providing the services in accordance with the contract.

8.3. CANCELLATION OF SCHEDULED TRIPS

The following may result in the temporary cancellation of a trip:

- Instruction by the Department on the basis of insufficient programme funds as budgeted for in the Provincial budget; closure of schools;
- Notification of service suspensions or reduction must be made at least 30 calendar days before the suspension or service reduction is to come into effect;
- Request by the Operator and agreed to in writing by the Department;
- The cancellation is due to unforeseen road closures, obstructions, floods or adverse weather conditions;
- In the opinion of the Department, the cancellation results from immediate danger to life or of personal injury and/or serious damage to property; or
- The cancellation is in the opinion of the Department due to strike or stay-away action of a general nature, i.e. not confined to the Operator's organisation. Therefore it is advisable that all operators must consider taking insurance for loss of income in the event of any of the above circumstances occur;
- Where the Department orders the Operator to provide services in circumstances where the Operator is of the opinion that there is immediate danger to life or of personal injury or of serious damage to property, the Operator may refuse to comply, in which case the matter shall be referred to the Department for decision within twenty-four (24) hours;
- Where the Operator is of the opinion that scheduled trips should be cancelled due to boycott action, either against the Operators firm or generally, the Operator must refer the matter to the Department for decision;
- The Operator must inform the Department within twenty four hours after the cancellation of any scheduled trips and also when the trips are recommenced. The Operator must also confirm the cancellation and resumption to the Department in writing with the reasons for the cancellation.
- Where a trip has not taken place due to factors outside the control of an Operator, and the School Principal representing the affected school where delivery has not

taken place agrees that the non-delivery was reasonable and justified, he/she may provide the Department with an official confirmation to this effect, the Department may, at its own discretion, accept the opinion of the Principal and make payment as if the trip was delivered.

8.4. FARES

- No fares shall be charged by operators to the approved learners for providing the learner transport services contracted in this agreement.

8.5. VARIATIONS

- The Department may after consultation with the Operator, recommend the following variations to the services within the service area, but the prior written consent of the Department is mandatory before any variation is effected and this will be communicated between the Department and the Operator.
- The Department will notify the Operator in writing of any variations made to the existing services and the Operator must comply with any such variations. The Operator may object to such variations in writing addressed to the Department within seven (7) working days of receipt of the notification.
- The decision of the Department in this regard shall be final and be communicated to the Operator in writing.
- The Operator must comply with the services set out in the Specifications in respect of routes and vehicles.
- The Department of Education cannot instruct the service provider with an intension to alter the Contract terms as that authority resides with the Department of Community Safety and Transport Management.

8.6. VEHICLES

- Only vehicles classified as mini-buses, midi- buses, standard buses or train buses can be used for this service operated by an approved driver.
- Operator is required to submit a statement on schedule of the Contract Forms, showing what vehicle will be available for services immediately upon award of contract.
- Identification – vehicles must have a letter from the Department that is displayed on the windscreen of the vehicle to identify it is a learner transport vehicle.
- Transport should be available for inspections anytime during school holidays.



8.6.1. Vehicles in an unsatisfactory condition

- Vehicles must be roadworthy and comply at all times with the National Road Traffic Act, 1996 and any other relevant legislation. Where a vehicle fails to comply with any legal requirement, it must be withdrawn from service immediately until the defect is rectified, and penalties will be imposed for failing to operate.

8.6.2. Vehicle Breakdowns

- The Operator is expected to provide a replacement vehicle for breakdowns within two hours of the vehicle breaking down.
- The honour lies with the Operator to inform the Department immediately in writing of the replacement vehicle, and should be of a similar capacity of the contracted vehicle.
- Submission of claim under these conditions does not change.

8.6.3. Failing to provide the right type, quality of vehicles

- Where Operator fails to provide the right type, quality and specification of vehicles as specified in the Special Conditions of Contract, the Department will immediately terminate the contract.

8.7. PENALTIES

- Penalties shall be imposed against Operator for each offence in accordance with Clause of the Special Conditions and the Department shall advise Transport Operator on monthly basis of penalties so imposed.
- The services shall be fully monitored during the duration of contract and penalties shall be imposed as set out hereunder.
- It is the duty of Operator to report all trips not operated late and early trips and any other information which is relevant to the calculation of payments. Where the Department report more trips not operated than those reported by the Operator for three (03) consecutive weeks, from the fourth week penalties will be doubled for the remaining period for all infringements not reported by the Transport Operator.
- No vehicle shall leave the first point of departure before the time listed in the time table or more than fifteen (15) minutes thereafter, failing which penalties will be imposed as set out below.
- Operator will be expected to adhere strictly to the requirements of the Specification.



8.7.1. Penalties will be imposed in the following events.

- Failing to provide specified trips where trips have not been fully provided, a penalty will be imposed, calculated as follows:
- 1st instance per route – no. of trips operated x agreed upon rate relating to that trip per the authorised route x 100%.
- 2nd instance per route – no. of trips not operated x agreed upon rate relating to that trip per the authorised route x 150%
- 3rd instance per route – no. of trips not operated x agreed upon rate relating to that trip per the authorised route x 200% and requirement of investigation report by Operator.
- Providing trips that depart late or early in the case of a trip that:
- Deliver between fifteen (15) and thirty (30) minutes late from the time the school starts, a penalty of R50 (Fifty Rand)
- Deliver between thirty (30) and forty five (45) minutes late from the time the school starts, a penalty of R100 (One hundred Rand)
- Deliver between forty five (45) and sixty (60) minutes late from the time the school starts, a penalty of R150 (One Hundred and Fifty Rand) will be imposed.
- Deliver more than sixty (60) minutes late from the time the school starts, a penalty of R200 (Two Hundred Rand) will be imposed.

8.8. INSURANCE

- The Operator must take reasonable steps to ensure the safety of passengers and property. The Department shall not be liable for any loss or damages resulting from damage to property or the death of or injury to any person which is caused by an intentional or negligent act or omission of the Operator or his agents or employees and the Operator hereby indemnifies the Department against all claims, demands, lawsuits, damages, costs (including attorney and client costs), charges and expenses whatsoever in this regard.
- The Operator must effect and maintain throughout the duration of the contract, at his/her own expense, passenger liability insurance cover to the value of R5 000 000.00 (Five Million Rands) or more per incident involving a learner transported by the contracted operator. Further a full comprehensive vehicle insurance based on the realistic market value of vehicle(s) with an insurance company chosen by the Operator which is registered with the Financial Services Board established by the Financial Services Board Act, 1990 and registered in the



Republic of South Africa in terms of Short Term Insurance Act 1998 or other applicable legislation.

8.9. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

- The Operator shall act as an independent contractor and not as an employee or agent of the Department and does not have the authority to bind the Department contractually to any other party.
- The Department shall not be liable to pay any retrenchment or severance benefits to any of the employees of the Operator on dismissal or on expiry of the contract period.

8.10. CESSION, DELEGATION AND SUB-CONTRACTING

- The Operator may not cede his or her rights or delegate his or her obligations under this contract without **Prior Written Consent** of the Department. In applying for consent, the Operator must supply the Department with a copy of the proposed agreement wherein such will be subject to approval by the Department who may unreasonably not withhold such approval.
- If consent is given for a sub-contracting, no contract between the Department and the sub-contractor shall come into being and the Operator shall not be released from any liability or obligation under the contract, and he/she shall be responsible for acts and omissions of any sub-contractor or his/her agents/workers as fully as if they were acts or omissions of the Operator.
- Department may at any time during the currency of this contract cede its rights and delegate its obligations in terms thereof of any transport authority.
- The Operator must not engage themselves in fronting. Should the Department be aware of fronting, the contract will be terminated.

8.11. MEDIATION IMPACTING ON SOCIETAL SECTOR BEHAVIOUR

- A mediation Committee shall be put in place to investigate and advise the Department. This is to protect all players in the sector.

Should it be discovered that the successful bidder/transport operator has engaged him/herself in fronting and/or subcontracting without consent of the Department, the contract will be terminated, and further legal steps will be taken.

8.21. PAYMENTS

8.21.1. Contracted service providers

- Contracted service providers will lodge their payment claims to the Department on or before 7th of each month after rendering service.
- Payments will be effected upon receipt of a signed original invoice, stamped and signed learner list.

8.22. BREACH OF CONTRACT

- The Department, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the operator, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
 - if the operator fails to deliver any or all of the service within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the Department pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
 - if the operator fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
 - if the operator, in the judgment of the Department, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- In the event the Department terminates the contract in whole or in part, the Department may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, services similar to those undelivered, and the operator shall be liable to the Department for any excess costs for such similar work or service. However, the operator shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- Where the Department terminates the contract in whole or in part, the Department may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the operator by prohibiting such operator from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years.
- If a Department intends imposing a restriction on an operator or any person associated with the operator, the operator will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the operator fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the Department may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the operator.
- Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer /Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer / Authority, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer / Authority actively associated.
- If a restriction is imposed, the Department must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:

- the name and address of the operator and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
- the date of commencement of the restriction
- the period of restriction; and
- the reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of operators or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

- If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.
- Breaching the contract in terms of the specification, purchase order, the delivery period shall result in the cancellation of the contract. The designated service provider shall bear any difference in price of the said supplies and these amounts plus any other damages which may be suffered by the State shall be paid by the designated service provider to the State immediately on demand.

8.23. INSPECTIONS

- The Department will conduct inspections before the award of contract, during the inception of the contract and for the duration of the entire contract period.

8.24. OBLIGATIONS

- The Department is obliged to ensure that the contracted service providers provide the Department of Community Safety and Transport Management with the approved service within the specified period.



 - (d) the intention or decision to submit or not to submit, a bid;
 - (e) the submission of a bid which does not meet the specifications and conditions of the bid; or
 - (f) bidding with the intention not to win the bid.
8. In addition, there have been no consultations, communications, agreements or arrangements with any competitor regarding the quality, quantity, specifications and conditions or delivery particulars of the products or services to which this bid invitation relates.
9. The terms of the accompanying bid have not been, and will not be, disclosed by the bidder, directly or indirectly, to any competitor, prior to the date and time of the official bid opening or of the awarding of the contract.

³ **Joint venture or Consortium means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract.**

10. I am aware that, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided to combat any restrictive practices related to bids and contracts, bids that are suspicious will be reported to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties in terms of section 59 of the Competition Act No 89 of 1998 and or may be reported to the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) for criminal investigation and or may be restricted from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years in terms of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act No 12 of 2004 or any other applicable legislation.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT
July 2010

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- (i) Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- (ii) To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

General Conditions of Contract

1. Definitions

1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
 - 1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
 - 1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
 - 1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
 - 1.4 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
 - 1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
 - 1.6 "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
 - 1.7 "Day" means calendar day.
 - 1.8 "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
 - 1.9 "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
 - 1.10 "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
 - 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the

RSA.

- 1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such

obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.

1.25 "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. Application

2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.

2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.

2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. General

3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.

3.2 With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za

4. Standards

4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5. Use of contract documents and information; inspection.

5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.

5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.

5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.

5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. Patent rights

6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

7. Performance security

- 7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
- (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5 Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6 Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7 Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or

analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.

8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. Packing

9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.

9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. Delivery and documents

10.1 Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.

10.2 Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.

11. Insurance

11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

12. Transportation

12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

13. Incidental services

13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:

- (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
- (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
- (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;

- (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
- (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.

13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14. Spare parts

14.1 As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

- (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
- (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty

15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.

15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.

15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.

15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.

15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take

such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

- 16. Payment**
- 16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- 16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.
- 17. Prices**
- 17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.
- 18. Contract amendments**
- 18.1 No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.
- 19. Assignment**
- 19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.
- 20. Subcontracts**
- 20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.
- 21. Delays in the supplier's performance**
- 21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- 21.3 No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.
- 21.4 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the

supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.

21.5 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.

21.6 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23. Termination for default

23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:

- (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
- (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
- (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.

23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.

23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.

23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any

person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.

23.5 Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer / Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer / Authority, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer / Authority actively associated.

23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:

- (i) the name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
- (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
- (iii) the period of restriction; and
- (iv) the reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

23.7 If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or anti-dumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which

may be due to him

25. Force Majeure

25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.

25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26. Termination for insolvency

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27. Settlement of Disputes

27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.

27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.

27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.

27.4 Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure specified in the SCC.

27.5 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,

- (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and
- (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

28. Limitation of Liability

28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;

- (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and

- (b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.
- 29. Governing language** 29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.
- 30. Applicable law** 30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified in SCC.
- 31. Notices** 31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice
- 31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.
- 32. Taxes and duties** 32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.
- 32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid the Department must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder. This certificate must be an original issued by the South African Revenue Services.
- 33. National Industrial Participation (NIP) Programme** 33.1 The NIP Programme administered by the Department of Trade and Industry shall be applicable to all contracts that are subject to the NIP obligation.
- 34 Prohibition of Restrictive practices** 34.1 In terms of section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder (s) is / are or a contractor(s) was / were involved in collusive bidding (or bid rigging).
- 34.2 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), based on reasonable grounds or evidence obtained by the purchaser, has / have engaged in the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties as contemplated in the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998.

- 34.3 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid(s) for such item(s) offered, and / or terminate the contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder(s) or contractor(s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder(s) or contractor(s) concerned.
