MEC MORWENG TO LEAD THE MARCH AGAINST POLICE KILLINGS

The MEC for the North West Department of Community Safety and Transport Management, Wessels Morweng will be leading a march against police killings this coming Monday. This follows the murder of an off-duty Police officer, Constable Boikanyo Molale in Ganyesa outside Vryburg whose body was found on Saturday morning at 5:30. The two suspects, aged 22 and 27 will be appearing in court on Monday, the 3rd of November 2025.

This is the second incident of Police murder in the same area in seven months following that of a 41-year-old of Constable Eric Tekolo in April. Three suspects aged 19, 23, and 25, were arrested and their court case is ongoing.

MEC Morweng is concerned about these killings which appear to be random but "a life lost is one too many", said MEC Morweng.

What is disturbing is that suspects in both murders are young people. "They are very young and that makes one wonder what could lead young people to commit such heinous crimes? What is wrong with our society to take a life of someone protecting the society. We must send a message to stop police killings. That is why I am appealing to local communities in Ganyesa to join us in the march I will be leading on Monday when suspects appear in court," said MEC Morweng.
